I am very *keen* to spend my vacations  
in Goa.

2. तीक्ष्ण, पैना, तेज़

Do you have a knife with a *keen* edge?

**Keep** (v.) कीप—1. रखना, पास रखना  
You may *keep* this pencil if you need it.

2. ध्यान रखना

*Keep* an eye on the child.

3. चलाना, चलना

*Keep* to the left of the road.

4. पूरा करना, निबाहना

Once you make a promise, you must  
*keep* it up.

(v.) 2. मजाक करना, चिढ़ाना

Are you *kidding* ?

**Kidney** (n.) किड्नी—गुरदा

My doctor is treating me for some *kidney* trouble.

**Kill** (v.) किल—मार डालना, हत्या करना

Don't you have anything to do except *killing* flies ?

2. नष्ट करना, बंद करना

The cold winter has *killed* the flowers in my garden.

**Kind** (n.) काइन्ड—1. वर्ग, जाति

I saw all *kinds* of people at the function.

2. किस्म, प्रकार

What *kind* of fabric is this?

(adj.) 3. कृपालु

It was very *kind* of you to help me.

**Kiss** किस—चुम्बन करना

(v.) The mother *kissed* her weeping child.

(n.) The mother gave the child a toffee and a *kiss*.

**Kit** (n.) किट—किट, सामान, औज़ार

Has the fisherman taken his *kit* for fishing ?

**Kitchen** (n.) किचिन—रसोईघर

Normally I have my meal in the *kitchen*.

**Kite** (n.) काइट—चील, पतंग

Do you know how to fly a *kite* ?

I saw a *kite* high up in the sky.

**Kitten** (n.) कितन—बिलौटा

Our pussy has given birth to four *kittens*.

**Knead** (v.) नीड—गूँधना, सानना

If you want soft bread, you must *knead* the flour well.

**Knee** (n.) नी—घुटना

My left *knee* was injured in a fall.

**Kneel** (v.) नील—घुटने टेकना

Let us *kneel* in prayer.

**Knife** (n.) नाइफ़—चाकू, छुरी

Please sharpen the edge of this *knife*.

**Knit** (v.) निट—बुनना

Can you *knit* a sweater ?

**Knob** (n.) नॉब—गुमटा, मूठ, दस्ता

We saw decorative *knobs* on all the doors in the royal palace.

**Knock** (v. & n.) नॉक—1. खटखट, खटखटाना

(v.) Who is *knocking* at the door ?

2. प्रहार करना, ठोंकना

The champion boxer *knocked* down his opponent very easily.

(n.) My sister opened the door at the first *knock*.

**Knot** (n.) नॉट—1. गाँठ, उलझन, बाँधना

Please untie this *knot* ?

2. समूह, पुंज

Why have these people gathered in *knots*.

3. गाँठ, ग्रंथि

This piece of wood is full of *knots*.

**Know** (v.) नो—1. जानना

I *know* the way to Surekha's house.

2. ज्ञान होना

Do you *know* geometry ?

3. परिचित होना

I *know* Sudhir because he was my classmate.
