**Mad** (adj.) मैड—1. पागल, विक्षिप्त

Has she gone *mad*?

2. उत्तेजित, क्रुद्ध

She felt *mad* when her servant burnt her favourite saree while ironing.

3. मूर्खतापूर्ण

The idea of leaving your house for ever is really *mad*.

**Magazine** (n.) मैगज़ीन—पत्रिका

The new *magazine* has offered many gifts to its subscribers.

**Magic** (n.) मैजिक—जादू

Many people still believe in *magic*.

Yesterday I took my children to a *magic* show.

**Magistrate** (n.) मैजिस्ट्रेट—दण्डनायक, दण्डाधिकारी

I have been summoned to the *magistrate's* court to give evidence.

**Magnificent** (adj.) मैग्निफिसेंट—शानदार

You can get a *magnificent* view of the sea from the terrace of our building.

**Magnify** (v.) मैग्निफाइ—आवर्धन करना, बढ़ाना  
This lens *magnifies* the object fifty times.

Look at this small insect through a *magnifying* glass.

**Maid** (n.) मेड—नौकरानी, कुमारी

Our *house-maid* is honest and industrious.

**Mail** (n.) मेल—डाक

Has the postman delivered today's *mail*?

**Main** (adj.) मेन—मुख्य, प्रमुख

The chief guest was the *main* speaker

at the school function.

Does this lane join the *main* road?

**Maintain** (v.) मेन्टेन—1. भरण-पोषण करना  
These days it's difficult to *maintain* a big family.

2. दावा करना

Do you still *maintain* that you were right?

3. (मरम्मत करके) ठीक-ठीक बनाए रखना

The old house costs a great deal to *maintain*.

**Major** (adj.) मेजर—1. मुख्य, बड़ा

The soldier spent *major* portion of his life in guarding the country's frontiers.

(n.) 2. वयस्क, बालिग

Is your brother a *major* now?

**Make** मेक—1. बनाना, निर्माण करना

(v.) Please *make* me a cup of tea.

My shirt is *made* of cotton.

All *men* are mortal.

2. नर, पुरुष, श्रमिक

Do you know that *man*?

Has the *milkman* not come yet?

**Manage** (v.) मैनिज—1. देखरेख करना, संभालना

Who *manages* your business?

2. सफल होना, युक्ति निकालना

Can you *manage* to come early?

3. वश में रखना

Would you be able to *manage* such naughty children?

**Manner** (n.) मैनर—ढंग, रीति प्रकार

Your friendly *manner* of speaking endears you to all.

**Manners** (n.) मैनर्स—शिष्टाचार

Your polished *manners* ensure a welcome for you everywhere.

**Mansion** (n.) मैन्शन—हवेली, कोठी, प्रासाद

We live in an old *mansion* built by our grandfather.

**Manufacture** (v.) मैन्युफैक्चर—उत्पादन करना, बनाना

What articles do you *manufacture* in your factory?

**Manuscript** (n.) मैन्युस्क्रिप्ट—पाण्डुलिपि, हस्तलिखित

Have you sent the *manuscript* of your story to the cinema company?

**Many** (adj.) मे'नि—अनेक, बहुत से

I met *many* old friends at the party.

**Map** (n.) मैप—नक्शा, मानचित्र

I want to buy a *map* of India.

**Marble** (n.) मार्बल—1. संगमरमर

Are you using *marble* in the construction of your house?

2. गोली, कंचा

My son plays *marbles* with his friends every evening.

**March** मार्च—प्रयाण (करना), कूच करना

(v.) We stood by the side of the road as the soldiers *marched* past.

(n.) The police barricaded the road to stop the agitationists' *march*.

**Margin** (n.) मार्जिन—हाशिया, किनारा, गुंजाइश

Always leave a *margin* when you write.

**Mark** (n.) मार्क—1. अंक, नंबर

How many *marks* did you get in mathematics?

2. निशान, चिह्न, चिह्नित करना, लगाना

We walked straight till we came to a *mark* indicating right turn.

There is a dirty *mark* on your shirt.

(v.) Vikas and Sonia were *marked* absent.

**Market** (n. & v.) मार्किट—बाजार, बेचना

(n.) I have to go to the *market* to buy some vegetables.

(v.) Our company *markets* electrical appliances.

**Marry** (v.) मैरि—विवाह करना/कराना

I hear Rekha *married* a doctor.

**Martyr** (n.) मार्टर्—शहीद, हुतात्मा

Have you visited the *martyrs'* memorial in Calcutta?

**Marvel** मार्वल—चमत्कार, आश्चर्य करना

(n.) Your house is full of *marvels* of technology.

(v.) We *marvel* at the way you help your friends.

(adj.) They had a *marvellous* journey through the Himalayas.

**Masculine** (adj.) मास्क्यूलिन—पुरषोचित, मरदाना

You have a deep, *masculine* voice.

**Mason** (n.) मेसन—राजमिस्त्री

We shall have to call a *mason* to repair this wall.

**Mass** (n.) मैस—ढेर, राशि

Look at the *mass* of dark clouds, it is about to rain.

**Masses** (n.) मैसिस—जनसमूह, भीड़

Your speeches have the power to move the *masses*.

**Massive** (adj.) मैसिव—भारी, विशाल

What is this *massive* machine supposed to do?

**Master** (n.) मास्टर—1. मालिक, अधिकारी, शिक्षक

Is your *master* at home?

(v.) 2. वश में कर लेना, अधिकार प्राप्त करना

Have you *mastered* this subject?

**Mat** (n.) मैट—चटाई, पायदान

We should get a new *mat* for our room.

**Match** (n.) मैच—1. दियासलाई

Where is the *match-box*?

2. मैच, प्रतियोगिता

Will you accompany me to the cricket *match*?

(adj.) 3. जोड़, जोड़ीदार, मेल खाना  
You are dressed in *matching* colours.  
(v.) These colours do not *match*.

**Mate** (n.) मेट—1. साथी, सखा  
Anil is my *class-mate*.  
2. पति-पत्नी, जोड़  
We want a *mate* for our parrot.

**Material** (n.) मटिरिअल—1. सामान, माल  
Have you got all the *material* for making a kite?  
2. कपड़ा  
Will you please show me some good-quality dress *material*?

**Matter** (n.) मैटर—1. विषय  
I want to discuss an important *matter* with you.  
2. बात, मामला  
What is the *matter* with you?  
(v.) 3. महत्त्व होना  
It *matters* a great deal.

**Mattress** (n.) मैट्रिस—गद्दा, तोशक  
What is the price of this foam rubber *mattress*?

**Maximum** (adj.) मैक्सिमम—अधिकतम, महत्तम  
What is the *maximum* number of people that you invite to your parties?

**May** (v.) मे—सम्भव होना, (अनुमति में) सकना  
*May* I go home now?  
I *may* go to Mumbai next month.  
You *may* take these clothes to the dry cleaner.

What time do you have your *meal*?

**Mean** (v.) मीन—1. अर्थ होना या रखना  
Do you really *mean* what you say?  
2. अर्थ, अभिप्राय  
Tell me what these words *mean* in Sanskrit.  
(adj.) 3. नीच, घटिया  
Never be *mean-minded*.

**Means** (n.) मीन्ज—1. सम्पत्ति, आय  
You are a man of various *means*.  
2. उपाय, साधन  
By what *means* did he climb the wall?

**Meanwhile** (adj.) मीनवाइल—इसी बीच, इतने में  
You write the letter, *meanwhile* I will get a stamp.

**Measure** (v.) मेज़र—1. माप का होना, मापना  
Please *measure* the length and breadth of this sheet.  
(n.) 2. उपाय  
New *measures* have been taken to prevent theft and cheating.

**Meat** (n.) मीट—मांस, गोश्त  
Go to the butcher's shop and buy some *meat*.

**Mechanic** (n.) मिकेनिक—मिस्त्री, मैकेनिक  
Call a *mechanic* to repair this typewriter.  
Manoj is interested in the *mechanism* of television.

**Medal** (n.) मेडल—पदक  
I hear your son got a gold *medal* for his essay.

**Meddle** (v.) मेडिल—दखलअन्दाजी करना  
We should not *meddle* in other people's affairs.

**Medicine** (n.) मेडिसिन—दवा, औषध  
What *medicine* has the doctor prescribed for your fever?  
(adj.) Delhi University has a very good *medical* college.

**Meek** (adj.) मीक—नम्र, विनीत  
You cannot forge ahead if you are too *meek*.

**Meet** (v.) मीट—1. मिलना, भेंट होना  
Where shall we *meet* tomorrow?  
2. मिलना, एकत्र हो जाना, जुड़ना  
Does this lane *meet* the main road?  
3. चुकाना  
Can you not *meet* my bill until next month?  
(n.) 4. सभा  
Will you attend the *meeting*?

**Melancholy** (adj.) मेलन्कोलि—उदास, दुःखी  
Why are you in such a *melancholy* mood?

**Melody** (n.) मेलोडि—1. लय, राग  
I shall now sing you an Indian classical *melody*.

Can you recite from *memory* the whole poem?

2. स्मृति, याद

I have happy *memories* of my first visit to America.

(*v.*) We must *memorize* our parts till the next rehearsal of play.

**Menace** (*n.*) मे'नस—खतरा, जोखिम (में डालना), धमकाना

(*n.*) Don't drive in such a way that you become a *menace* to the pedestrians.

(*v.*) It is *menacing* to cross a highway amid speeding trucks.

**Mend** (*v.*) मे'न्ड—मरम्मत करना, ठीक कर देना  
Cobbler, cobbler, *mend* my shoes!

We will have to *mend* our fence.

*Mend* your ways if you want to improve your financial condition.

**Mental** (*adj.*) मे'न्टल—1. मानसिक चिकित्सालय, पागलखाना

Is there a *mental-hospital* in your city?

2. मनोभाव, मनोवृत्ति, मन का

By *mental* effort we can remember the details of past happenings.

(*adv.*) I was *mentally* unprepared for such a situation.

(*n.*) You have an unusual *mentality* if you do not like games.

**Mention** (*n.*) मे'न्शन—उल्लेख, जिक्र  
There was *mention* of poor boy's

bravery in the article.

(*v.*) You may *mention* my name to him.

**Menu** (*n.*) मे'न्यू—व्यंजन-सूची, भोजन  
Waiter, please bring the *menu*.

**Merchant** (*n.*) मे'र्चॅन्ट—व्यापारी, दुकानदार  
My uncle is a wholesale grain *merchant*.

**Mercy** (*n.*) मर्सि—दया, करुणा  
Oh God, have *mercy* on us!

**Mere** (*adj.*) मिअर्—निरा, मात्र  
You are still a *mere* boy.

**Merely** (*adv.*) मिअर्लि—केवल, मात्र, सिर्फ  
I *merely* want to give her a little advice.

**Merry** (*adj.*) मे'रि—1. आनन्दित, प्रमुदित  
Wish you *merry* Christmas!

2. प्रसन्नचित्त, जिन्दादिल

The *merry* laughter of children cheers up all.

**Mess** (*n.*) मे'स—1. गड़बड़ी, बखेड़ा, गंदगी  
You will have to clear up this *mess* before you leave from here.

2. मेस, भोजनालय

Do you take your food from a *mess*?

**Message** (*n.*) मे'सिज—संदेश  
Please give him this *message*.

**Metal** (*n.*) मे'टल—धातु  
Of what *metal* are these articles made?

**Method** (*n.*) मे'थड—ढंग, तरीका, रीति  
By what *method* will you solve this sum?

**Mew** (*v.*) म्यू—म्याँव (करना)  
I hear a cat *mewing* outside the door.

**Microphone** (*n.*) माइक्रोफोन—माइक, ध्वनिग्राहक  
We could not hear your speech, as the *microphone* was not working properly.

**Microscope** (*n.*) माइक्रोस्कोप—सूक्ष्मदर्शी, खुर्दबीन  
I could inspect the tiny insect only through a *microscope*.

**Middle** मिडल—1. मध्य, दरमियानी, बीच में  
(*n.*) Don't disturb me in the *middle* of my work.

There was a pillar in the *middle* of the room.

(*adj.*) 2. अधेड़

Who is that *middle-aged* gentleman?

**Might** (n.) माइट—1. शक्ति, सामर्थ्य

I tried with all my *might* to move the heavy load.

2. May का भूतकाल

He *might* have returned home.

**Mild** (adj.) माइल्ड—1. कोमल, सौम्य, नरम

You always speak in a *mild* manner.

2. सुहावना

The weather is *mild* today.

3. हल्का

It was the first offence of that woman, so she was given a *mild* sentence.

**Mile** (n.) माइल—मील

I walk a couple of *miles* every morning.

**Military** (adj. & n.) मिलिटरी—सैनिक, फौजी, सेना, फौज

(adj.) Do they give you *military* training in your school?

(n.) Strict discipline is followed in the *military*.

**Milk** (n.) मिल्क—दूध, दुग्ध

I take a glass of *milk* every morning.

**Mill** (n.) मिल—चक्की, कारखाना, मिल

How many textile *mills* are there in your city?

**Million** (adj.) मिल्यन—दस लाख, दशलक्ष

The tennis champion earned *millions* of dollars.

I learn your guest is a *millionaire*.

**Mince** (v.) मिन्स—क्रीमा करना, काटकर टुकड़े-टुकड़े करना

I want to buy half a kilo of *minced* meat.

**Mind** (n.) माइन्ड—1. मन, चित्त

Is your *mind* on your job?

2. इरादा, विचार

I thought I would return the same day but now I have changed my *mind*.

(v.) 3. (पर) ध्यान देना, चिन्ता करना, बुरा मानना  
Don't *mind* what he says. Never *mind*.

4. देखरेख करना

Who *minds* your child when you are away?

5. आपत्ति करना, आपत्ति होना

Would you *mind* if I smoke?

**Mine** माइन—1. मेरा

(pron.) That book is yours, this one is *mine*.

(n.) 2. खान, खदान

During our tour of Bihar we visited a coal *mine*.

**Mingle** (v.) मिनाल—मिलाना, मिलना-जुलना

Some policemen in plainclothes *mingled* with the crowd.

I like to *mingle* with all sorts of people.

**Minimum** (adj.) मिनिमम—कम से कम, अल्पतम

The trade unions demanded an increase in the *minimum* wages.

Who promise to give the maximum value at the *minimum* price?

**Minister** (n.) मिनिस्टर—मंत्री

A close friend of mine has now become a *minister* in the cabinet.

**Minor** (adj.) माइनर्—1. छोटा, गौण

Don't bother me about such *minor* matters.

(n.) 2. नाबालिग, अल्पवयस्क, अवयस्क

My son can't vote, as he is still a *minor*.

**Minus** माइनस—1. ऋण, ऋणात्मक

(n.) Arithmetic begins with plus and *minus*.

(prep.) 2. सिवाय, बिना

Why have you come *minus* your cap?  
As I arrived at my office I found that I was *minus* my golden chain.

**Minute** मिनिट/माइन्यूट—1. मिनट, क्षण, मेमो, नोट

(n.) I can do this job in ten *minutes*.

(adj.) सूक्ष्म, अति लघु

I did not notice the *minute* specks of dirt on my specs.

(adv.) The advocate studied the case *minutely*.

**Miracle** (n.) मिरॅकल—चमत्कार, करामात

As a *miracle* most of the passengers were saved when their bus fell into a gorge.

(adj.) Yesterday I was involved in an accident but had a *miraculous* escape.

**Mirror** (n.) मिरर—आईना, शीशा

Who broke the *mirror*?

**Mischief** (n.) मिसचिफ़—1. शरारती, नटखट

My youngest son is always up to some *mischief*.

(adj.) A *mischievous* boy drew a cartoon on the blackboard.

(n.) 2. हानि

You are too late, the *mischievous* is done.

**Miser** (n.) माइजर—कंजूस, कृपण

Some rich people behave like *misers*.

(adj.) I do not like people with *miserly* habits.

**Misery** (n.) मिजरि—दुर्दशा, विपत्ति, दुःख

I have seen people live in great *misery* because of poverty.

(adj.) Why do you look so *miserable*?

**Miss** (v.) मिस—1. चूकना, न मिलना

If you do not hurry, you will *miss* the train.

2. अभाव का अनुभव करना

We shall all *miss* you when you go away.

3. न कर, सुन या देख पाना

I learnt she was at the party but I *missed* her.

4. अभाव मालूम हो जाना, गुम होना

One of my books is *missing*.

(n.) 5. कुमारी

What is your name, *miss*?

**Mission** (n.) मिशन—1. दूतावास

Are you working with the Indian *mission* in the USA?

2. दूतकार्य, शिष्टमण्डल

I was sent on a *mission* to Sri Lanka.

3. जीवन-लक्ष्य

Spreading education among the poor is the *mission* of my life.

**Mist** (n.) मिस्ट—कुहरा

I did not go for my morning walk because of the *mist*.

**Mistake** मिस्टेक—1. भूल/गलती (करना)

(n.) You have made a *mistake* in this sentence.

I took your book by *mistake*.

(v.) 2. दूसरा समझना

I *mistook* you for your younger brother.

**Mix** (v.) मिक्स—1. मिश्रण करना, मिलाना

Sita *mixed* some water in the orange squash to make a cold drink.

2. मिलना-जुलना

You are good at *mixing* with people.

(adj.) 3. उलझन में

You are all *mixed up*.

(n.) Water is a *mixture* of hydrogen and oxygen.

**Moan** मोन—कराह, कराहना

(v.) Are you in pain? You were *moaning* in your sleep.

(n.) The wounded man's *moans* could be heard all the night.

**Mob** (n.) मॉब—1. उत्तेजित भीड़, जनसाधारण

From my window I saw the police firing in the air to disperse the riotous *mob*.

(v.) 2. मिलकर घेर लेना, तंग करना

As we stood outside the theatre we saw the popular film star being *mobbed* by his fans.

**Mobile** (adj.) मोबाइल—चलना, गतिशील

We have a *mobile* post office in our city.

**Mock** (v.) मॉक—1. उपहास करना, हँसी उड़ाना

If I fail my friends would *mock* at me.

(adj.) 2. नकली, दिखावटी

Have you ever participated in a *mock* Parliament?

**Model** (adj.) माडल—1. नमूना

I bought a *model* aeroplane for my son.

Please show me the *model* of the proposed hospital building.

2. आदर्श

Your son is a *model* student.

(n.) 3. मॉडल

I learn your daughter is working as a *model*.

My car is a five-year old *model*.

(v.) 4. (किसी व्यक्ति का) अनुकरण करना

She is *modelling* herself on her aunt.

**Moderate** (v.) मॉडरेट/मोडरेट—1. मंद, नरम,

अपनी इच्छा आदि को कम करना

If you *moderate* your demands a little, the firm may be able to concede them.

2. कम होना

Now the storm is *moderating*?

(adj.) 3. मन्द, नरम

I like the *moderate* weather of your town.

**Modern** (adj.) मॉडर्न—आधुनिक, आजकल का

You should always have a *modern* outlook on life.

**Modest** (*adj.*) मॉडिस्ट—1. विनीत, विनयशील  
The *modest* behaviour of Sushila impressed every one at the party.

2. मर्यादित

I paid a *modest* price for this embroidered table-cloth.

**Moist** (*adj.*) मॉइस्ट—गीला, भीगा हुआ  
Dry your *moist* hands with this towel.

**Moment** (*n.*) मोमेंट—क्षण, पल  
Getting the Nobel prize is the happiest *moment* for any scientist.

Our friend should be here any *moment*.

(*adj.*) The pain will just be *momentary*.

**Money** (*n.*) मनी—रुपया-पैसा  
Can you lend me some *money*?

**Monitor** (*n.*) मॉनिटर—छात्रनायक, कक्षानायक, प्रबोधक

My son has been made the *monitor* of his class.

**Monsoon** (*n.*) मॉन्सून—बरसात, वर्षा-ऋतु  
Now that the *monsoon* is near we must repair our leaking roof.

**Month** (*n.*) मन्थ—महीना, मास  
I have not come to you for a *month*.  
(*adj.*) Is this a *monthly* magazine?

**Monument** (*n.*) मॉन्यूमेंट—स्मारक, कीर्ति स्तम्भ  
Have you seen all the old *monuments* in Delhi?

**Mood** (*n.*) मूड—मनोदशा, चित्तवृत्ति  
The boss seems to be in a happy *mood* today.  
I want to speak to him when he is in a better *mood*.

**Moon** (*n.*) मून—चन्द्रमा, शशि  
Look at the full *moon*!

**Mop** (*n.*) मॉप—झाड़न  
Ask the maid-servant to clean the floor with a *mop*.  
(*v.*) She was *mopping* the floor.

**Moral** (*adj.*) मॉरल—1. नैतिक, सदाचारी  
We should try to lead a *moral* life.  
(*n.*) 2. शिक्षा, सीख  
What is the *moral* of this story?

**More** मोर्—अधिक, ज्यादा  
(*adj.*) Put *more* milk in this cup.  
I have *more* pencils than pens.  
(*adv.*) You must walk *more* briskly.

**Morning** (*n.*) मॉर्निंग—प्रभात, सवेरा  
At what time do you get up in the *morning*.

**Morsel** (*n.*) मॉर्सल—ग्रास, कौर  
I pitied the beggar entreating everyone for a *morsel* of food.

**Mortal** मॉर्टल—मर्त्य, मनुष्य  
(*adj.*) All men are *mortal*.  
No *mortal* can expect to live much longer than a hundred years.

**Mosquito** (*n.*) मॉस्कीटो—मच्छर  
*Mosquitoes* breed in the stagnant water.

**Moss** (*n.*) मॉस—काई  
Don't swim in that lake, it is full of *moss*.

**Most** (*adv. & adj.*) मोस्ट—1. सबसे अधिक, अत्याधिक

(*adv.*) Which book do you find the *most* interesting?

(*adj.*) अधिकांश, ज्यादातर

*Most* of my friends are science students.

**Motion** (*n.*) मोशन—1. गति, चाल  
You must not open the door of the compartment while the train is in *motion*.

2. प्रस्ताव

Was your *motion* carried in the meeting?

**Motive** (*n.*) मोटिव—प्रेरणा, हेतु  
What was your *motive* in telling me a lie?

**Mould** मोल्ड—1. गढ़ना, साँचे में ढालना  
(*v.*) If you want to become a sculptor, you must first learn how to *mould* clay.

(*n.*) 2. साँचा, ढाँचा

Are these cups made from a *mould*?

3. फफूंदी

Don't eat that bread, it is full of *mould*.

**Mound** (*v.*) माउन्ड—टीला  
My children like to climb a *mound* near our house.

**Mount** (*v.*) माउन्ट—1. चढ़ना, सवारी करना  
Can you *mount* a horse?  
2. फ्रेम चढ़ाना  
Please *mount* my photographs with silver frames.

3. राशि या आकार बढ़ना या बढ़ाना  
Don't you think that your debts are *mounting* up ?

**Mountain** (n.) माउन्टिन—पर्वत, पहाड़  
Next summer I shall go trekking in the *mountains*.

(adj.) Nepal is a *mountainous* country.

**Mourn** (v.) मोर्न—शोक करना/मनाना  
We all *mourned* the death of our kind neighbour.

**Mouse** (n.) माउस—चुहिया  
I want to buy a *mouse-trap*.

**Mouth** (n.) माउथ—1. मुँह, मुख  
Always keep your *mouth* clean.

2. मुहाना

Has the gardener *mowed* the lawn ?

**Much** (pron.) मँच—बहुत, प्रायः  
How *much* did you pay for this pen ?  
(adj.) Is there *much* water in the jug ?  
(adv.) Thank you very *much*.

**Mud** (n.) मँड—कीचड़  
Take care Rakesh, lest you would fall in the *mud*.

Don't bring your *muddy* shoes into the room.

**Muddle** मडल—गड़बड़ी, अव्यवस्था, अस्तव्यस्त कर देना

(n.) Everything in the house was in a *muddle*.

(v.) If your mind is *muddled* you cannot think clearly.

**Mug** (n.) मँग—प्याला  
I like to drink coffee from a *mug*.

**Multiply** (v.) मल्टिप्लाई—1. गुणा करना  
If we *multiply* 4 by 6, the result is 24.

2. बढ़ना, बढ़ाना  
Flies *multiply* fast.

(n.) Have you learnt *multiplication* ?

**Multitude** (n.) मल्टिट्यूड—भीड़, जनसाधारण  
I was impressed by the *multitude* of people at yesterday's public meeting.

**Mumble** (v.) मम्बल—गुनगुनाना, फुसफुसाना  
The child was *mumbling* in the sleep.

**Municipal** (adj.) म्यूनिसिपल—नगर, नगरपालिका-सम्बंधित  
Are you a candidate for the coming *municipal* elections ?

**Murder** मर्डर—खून, हत्या (करना)  
(v.) The young girl was *murdered* at midnight.

(n.) Have the police caught the *murderer* ?

Who was accused of the *murder* ?

**Murmur** मॅर्मर—मरमराना, सरसराना, मरमराहट  
(n.) When I entered the room the *murmur* of conversation stopped.

(v.) She *murmured* but no one knew what she said.

**Muscle** (n.) मसल—पेशी, बाहुबल  
We should work with the hands to develop our *muscles*.

(adj.) I have *muscular* pain in the left arm.

**Museum** (n.) म्यूज़ीअम—संग्रहालय, अजायबघर  
Have you seen the Salar Jang *museum* of Hyderabad ?

**Music** (n.) म्यूज़िक—संगीत  
I love *music* very much but I am not skilled in it.

(adj.) Which *musical* instrument do you play ?

**Muslin** (n.) मँजलिन—मलमल  
Is your frock made of *muslin* ?

**Must** मॅस्ट—अवश्य, आवश्यक वस्तु  
(v.) It is very late, I *must* go home now.

(n.) This book is a *must* for every student of history.



**Mutter** (v.) मॅटर—बुदबुदाना, फुसफुसाना  
What are you *muttering* under your breath?

**Mutton** (n.) मॅटन—भेड़ का मांस  
I went to the butcher's shop to buy some *mutton*.

**Muzzle** (v.) मज़ल—1. मुँह पर जाली लगाना  
You should *muzzle* your ferocious dog.

2. दबा देना; नियंत्रण करना  
How can democracy survive when the Press is *muzzled*?

3. नालमुख  
Be careful while cleaning the *muzzle* of the gun.

**Mystery** (n.) मिस्टरि—रहस्य, भेद  
The detective novel ended with the solving of the murder *mystery*.
