



**Table** (n.) टेबल—1. मेज़

Put the tea-pot on the *table*.

We sit at the *table* at meal-times.

2. तालिका

Before we buy a book we always look at the *table* of contents.

**Tablet** (n.) टैब्लिट—टिकिया

The doctor told me to take the *tablet* every four hours.

**Tack** (v.) टैक—1. टाँकना

If you *tack* the dress I shall be able to try it on.

2. हवा के विरुद्ध जहाज़ को चलाना

We had to *tack* to reach the harbour.

3. मोटे सिरे का पतला कील जड़ना

I *tack* the picture to the frame.

**Tackle** (v.) टैकल—1. हाथ में लेना, में जुट जाना

Aunt says she must *tackle* a lot of sewing today.

(n.) 2. कील-काँटा

You can buy a fishing *tackle* at this shop.

3. फुटबॉल मैच में प्रतिपक्षी को रोकने की क्रिया

That was a fine *tackle*?

**Tact** (n.) टैक्ट—कला, व्यवहार-कौशल

You have the *tact* of persuading the men to go back to work.

It was very *tactless* of her to tell them to go home.

**Tag** (n.) टैग—लुप्पी, लेबल, लटकन

Every article in the shop should bear a *tag* showing its price.

**Tail** (n.) टेल—1. पूँछ

Most animals and birds have *tails*. The monkey uses its *tail* when climbing trees.

2. दुम से मिलती-जुलती वस्तु, पुछल्ला

I fastened a *tail* to my kite.

**Tailor** (n.) टेलर—दरज़ी, कपड़े सीने वाला

Is your cousin not a *tailor*?

My *tailor* is expert in stitching woollen suits.

**Take** (v.) टेक—1. ले जाना

Father is going to *take* Hamid and Majid to the sea for fishing.

2. पकड़ना

My father *takes* the 9 a.m. bus to go to his office.

3. लगना

It will *take* half an hour to reach there.

4. ले जाकर देना

Please *take* this bag to your mother.

5. किराये पर लेना

We have *taken* this room for a month.

6. विजय प्राप्त करना

After heavy fighting the army *took* control of the city.

7. लेना

Do you *take* any interest in drawing?

Balwant Singh will *take* off his turban.

**Tale** (n.) टेल—1. कहानी, कथा, किस्सा

The mother told the child a fairy *tale* before making her sleep.

2. विवरण, वृत्तान्त

The reporters told different *tales* about the accident.

**Talent** (n.) तैलेंट—प्रतिभा, योग्यता, क्षमता  
She showed her *talent* for painting at a very early age.

(adj.) Raja is a very *talented* boy.

**Talk** टॉक—बोलना, बातचीत करना, वार्तालाप  
(v.) The baby cannot *talk* yet, but as she grows up, she will learn to *talk*.  
Vagish often *talks* to his parents about his college.

Please stop *talking* and listen to me.

(n.) We had a long *talk* about going to Mumbai.

**Tall** (adj.) टॉल—लम्बा, ऊँचा  
Sony is a *tall* girl.  
Rita is *taller* than Sony.  
She is the *tallest* in our family.  
There are some very *tall* buildings in Mumbai.  
How *tall* are you?

**Tame** टेम—पालतू, पालतू बनाना  
(adj.) A cat is a *tame* animal. It is not wild.

There are *tame* elephants in the zoo on whose backs children can have rides.

(v.) Coaches *tame* animals in circus.

**Tangle** टैन्गल—गुच्छा (उलझा हुआ), उलझना  
(n.) Her hair is in a *tangle*.  
(v.) The kitten played with sister's knitting wool and *tangled* it up.

**Tank** (n.) टैंक—1. तालाब, कुण्ड  
We have a *tank* for rain-water at our backdoor.

2. मिलिट्री टैंक

*Tanks* are used in war. They are able to cross rough land.

3. टंकी, तेल ढोने वाला जहाज़

A ship specially made to carry oil is called a *tanker*.

**Tap** (n.) टेप—1. नलका, टूटी  
See that all the *water-taps* are turned off before you leave the house.  
Who left the *tap* running?

2. एक हल्की चपत

She felt a *tap* on her shoulder.

**Tape** (n.) टेप—1. फीता, माप-पट्टी  
The dress-maker uses a *tape* when he measures a man for a new dress.

2. आवाज़ रिकार्ड करना, रिकार्ड की गई आवाज़  
(v.) Did you *tape* Lata's new song?

(n.) Have you heard Lata's latest *tape*.

**Tar** (n.) टार्—तारकोल

*Tar* was applied to the roof of the house to make it waterproof.

**Tardy** (adj.) टार्डी—सुस्त, मंदगति

I was *tardy* in replying to her letter.

**Target** (n.) टार्गेट—लक्ष्य

Their *target* was to collect five thousand rupees for the poor.

**Tariff** (n.) टैरिफ़—शुल्कदर

The *tariff* at our hotel was thirty rupees for lunch and dinner.

**Tarnish** (v.) टार्निश—बदरंग हो जाना

Your silver glasses will be *tarnished* unless you polish them often.

Your bad behaviour will *tarnish* your name.

**Tarpaulin** (n.) तरपॉल—

The luggage was packed on a lorry and covered with a large *tarpaulin*.

**Tart** (adj.) टार्ट—चरपरा, तीखा

Some fruits are very *tart* before we add sugar.

This mango is very *tart*. It can't be eaten.

**Task** (n.) टास्क—1. काम, कर्तव्य

One of my *tasks* is to teach my niece.

(v.) 2. काम का अतिरिक्त बोझ (लेना)

Never *task* your strength by carrying heavy loads.

**Taste** टेस्ट—स्वाद, जायका, स्वाद लेना, चखना

(n.) Lemons have a sour *taste*.

(v.) The brave never *taste* of death but once.

(adj.) This mango is quite *tasteless*—it is neither sweet nor sour.

(adj.) Aunt made for us a *tasty* cake.

2. गुण एवं दोष का ज्ञान, रुचि

My sister has a good *taste* in make-up.

**Tax** (v. & n.) टैक्स—कर, महसूल, टैक्स (लगाना)

(v.) The new laws did not *tax* the people heavily.

(n.) Have you paid the water *tax*?  
Taxes are levied on property, income, profits and many other items.

**Taxi** (n.) टैक्सी—किराये की गाड़ी (टैक्सी)  
Taxis go about the streets for people to hire them. They are driven by *taxi-drivers*.  
Bring me a *taxi* for New Delhi railway-station.

**Tea** (n.) टी—चाय की पत्ती, चाय की पत्ती उबालकर ओर दूध और चीनी मिलाकर बनाया हुआ पेय  
Mother makes *tea*. She pours boiling water on *tea*-powder, and mixes milk and sugar. Thus *tea* becomes ready.  
The Darjeeling *tea* is famous world over.

**Teach** (v.) टीच—सिखलाना, शिक्षा देना, पढ़ाना  
The teachers *teach* us very efficiently.  
We must *teach* the baby to talk properly.

**Team** (n.) टीम—दो या उससे अधिक लोग जो एकसा काम सहयोग से करते हैं।  
Ravi is a member of the cricket *team* in his school.  
(adj.) We should do our work with a *team* spirit.

**Tear** टे'अर्—1. फाड़ना, चीरना, फटाव  
(v.) Rama has *torn* her frock.  
(n.) Her mother will mend the *tear*.  
2. आँसू  
When we cry, *tears* drop from our eyes.  
She was in *tears* to see her new doll broken.

**Tease** (v.) टीज़—तंग करना, परेशान करना  
Don't *tease* animals.  
Don't take my words seriously, I was only *teasing* you.

**Technical** (adj.) टे'क्निकल—तकनीकी, प्राविधिक  
Have you got a *technical* training to handle this kind of machinery?  
It is a *technical* error. Ordinary man can't judge it.

**Tedious** (adj.) टीडिअँस—नीरस, थकाने वाला, उबाने वाला  
The speaker's speech became *tedious* after he had been talking for twenty minutes.

**Telecommunication** (n.) टेलिकैम्यूनि-केशन—दूरसंचार

The government sends messages to distant places by *telecommunication*.

**Telegraph** (n.) टे'लिग्राफ—तार-यंत्र, तार-प्रेक्षण  
*Telegraph* the news of the accident to the injured boy's father.

**Telephone** टेलिफोन—दूरभाष (पर बात करना) टेलीफोन (करना)

(v.) Mother *telephoned* father.

You can *telephone* from here.

(n.) Never talk senselessly on *telephone*.

**Telescope** (n.) टे'लिसकोप—दूरबीन

*Telescopes* are much used at sea.

The scientists use *telescopes* to study the stars.

**Television** (n.) टे'लिविज़न—दूरदर्शन

*Cable TV* is getting popular in all the cities of India.

*Television* programmes have great influence on the minds of our youth.

**Tell** (v.) टै'ल—1. बताना, कहना, प्रकट करना  
*Tell* me what you want.

Kindly *tell* the Principal that I want to see him.

2. कल्पना करना

It is difficult to *tell* the end of this struggle.

3. आज्ञा देना

I have *told* you many times that you must obey the rules of the institution.

**Temper** (n.) टे'म्पर—मिज़ाज, मनोदशा, तबियत, प्रकृति

My father is in a bad *temper* today because he is very angry with me.

**Temperament** (n.) टेम्पैरैमे'न्ट—प्रकृति, स्वभाव, मिज़ाज

Rupa has a sad *temperament*, she is often unhappy.

**Temperate** (adj.) टे'म्परिट—संयमी, संतुलित  
Bangalore has a *temperate* climate.

You are a very *temperate* man, for you neither eat, nor drink more than what is good for you.

**Temperature** (n.) टे'म्पिचर—तापमान

The girl had a high *temperature*

yesterday, but now she is normal.  
What was the maximum *temperature* yesterday?

**Tempest** (n.) टेम्पिस्ट—तूफान, झंझावात  
The *tempest* destroyed the ships on the seashore.  
(adj.) Our ship rolled heavily in the *tempestuous* sea.

**Temporary** (adj.) टेम्पेररि—अस्थायी, काम चलाऊ  
The church hall will be used as a *temporary* school until the new school is built.  
This post is quite *temporary*.  
I want to get a *temporary* job because I am waiting for my appointment in the university.  
(adj.) I have managed a room *temporarily*.

**Tempt** (v.) टेम्प्ट—लुभाना, बहकाना, प्रेरित करना  
Do not *tempt* the little boy to eat too many sweets.  
Can I *tempt* you to have some more of this cake?  
(n.) I can't resist the *temptation* of buying clothes.  
(adj.) The cake is very *tempting*, but I cannot eat any more.

**Ten** (adj.) टेन—दस  
She will come back on the *tenth* of this month.  
Five and five make *ten*.

**Tenant** (n.) टेनेन्ट—किरायेदार  
Every month the landlord collects the rent from his *tenants*.  
Our *tenant* is a very gentle fellow.

**Tend** (v.) टेन्ड—1. देखभाल करना, ध्यान देना, (का कारण उत्पन्न करना)  
Nurses *tend* sick people. They serve mankind.  
Ranjana's accident will *tend* to make her more careful while crossing roads.  
2. प्रवृत्त होना, की ओर झुकना  
Father *tends* to get tired in the evening.

**Tender** (adj.) टेन्डर—1. कोमल, सहृदय  
You have such a *tender* skin that the slightest knock bruises it.

Mother is *tender* with her baby.

2. छोटी उम्र  
This solid food is not suitable for the child in *tender* age.

(n.) 3. टेंडर, ठेकेदार द्वारा प्रस्तुत होने वाले काम के लिए देय राशि का ब्यौरा (पहले से प्रस्तुत)  
The council has invited *tenders* for the building of a hall.

(v.) 4. प्रस्तुत करना  
Have you *tendered* your resignation from the post of editor.

**Tenement** (n.) टेनिमन्ट—एक बड़ा मकान जिसको अनेक हिस्सों में स्वतन्त्रा रूप से बाँटा जा सके  
Two large houses have been divided into *tenements*.

**Tennis** (n.) टेनिस—टेनिस नामक खेल  
Two players played on a *tennis* court.  
*Tennis* is very popular in European countries.

**Tense** (adj.) टेन्स—1. तनावयुक्त  
The whole audience was *tense* with excitement about the result of the music competition.  
(n.) 2. काल  
There are three *tenses* in grammar—past *tense*, present *tense* and future *tense*.

**Tent** (n.) टेन्ट—तम्बू, खेमा, शिविर  
A *tent* is made of canvas. It is held in place by tent-pegs.

**Term** (n.) टर्म—अवधि, मियाद, सत्र  
I was absent from college for the whole of the summer *term*.

**Terms** (n.) टर्म्स—शर्तें, समझौता  
Find out the *terms* on which we can get a room for the holidays.  
If you are willing to sell your house we can settle the *terms*.

**Terminate** (v.) टर्मिनेट—समाप्त होना, समाप्त करना  
The manager *terminated* the services of the clerk because he had disobeyed him.

**Terminal** (adj.) टर्मिनल—तिमाही, त्रैमासिक, आखिरी  
Have you had your *terminal* examinations?

- Terminus** (n.) टर्मिनस—अन्तिम स्टेशन, जहाँ रेलगाड़ी और बसों का मेल हो  
Wait for them at the bus *terminus*.  
All passengers must leave the lorry at the *terminus*.  
Do you travel up to the *terminus*?
- Terrace** (n.) टे'रस—चबूतरा, छज्जा, वेदिका  
Rachna and Minakshi had tea on the *terrace*.
- Terrible** (adj.) टे'रिबल—1. भयानक, भीषण, प्रचण्ड, तीव्र, सख्त  
There was a *terrible* storm in which many ships were wrecked.  
I can't bear this *terrible* cold.
- Terrify** (v.) टे'रिफाई—भयभीत करना, दहलाना  
Our dog *terrified* the ducks when it jumped into the pond.  
I am *terrified* of walking home at night.
- Territory** (n.) टे'रिटरी—क्षेत्र  
There is a great deal of forest *territory* in India.
- Terror** (n.) टे'रर—त्रास, आतंक, दहशत  
Animals have a great *terror* of fire.  
She has a particular *terror* of floods.
- Test** टे'स्ट—परीक्षण (करना), जांच (करना)  
(n.) Her teacher gave her a *test* in spelling.  
(v.) Before we buy an equipment we should always *test* it.  
The teacher *tested* the new student.
- Testament** (N.) टे'स्टामेंट—विधान  
The Old and New *Testaments* are the two parts that make up the Bible.
- Testify** (v.) टे'स्टिफाई—प्रमाणित करना, सिद्ध करना  
When we speak to the judge we *testify* before him.  
(n.) What we say is our *testimony*.
- Tether** (v.) टे'दर—खूँटे पर बाँधना  
*Tether* your horse to this post while you go for shopping.
- Text** (n.) टे'क्स्ट—मूल पाठ, मूल विषय  
The *text* of a book does not include the pictures.  
We have a separate *textbook* for each subject at college.
- Textile** (n.) टे'क्स्टाइल—कपड़ा, वस्त्र का उद्योग  
My friend works in a *textile* mill.

- Than** (conj.) दैन—(की) अपेक्षा, (की) बनिस्पत  
A motor-cycle can go faster *than* a bicycle.  
You like me better *than* he.  
You like me better *than* him.

- Thank** थैन्क—धन्यवाद (देना), शुक्रिया (अदा करना), कृतज्ञता (प्रकट करना)  
(v.) You must *thank* your lucky stars that you were not in the house when the robbers attacked it.  
(n.) Please convey my *thanks* to your mother for the nice sweets she sent for me.  
(adj.) I am *thankful* to you for your timely help.

- That** (pron.) दैट—वह, अर्थात्, यानी, जो  
This is the dog *that* bit the thief. This is the cat *that* killed a rat.  
I told Ramesh I hated him, and at *that* he immediately left the room.  
He's a cutler—*that* is to say, a man who sells knives and sharp tools.  
This is the girl *that* lives at Lajpat Nagar.

- Thatch** (v.) थैच—छप्पर डालना  
We were living in a *thatched* hut.  
The cottage had been newly *thatched*.
- Thaw** थॉ—द्रवण, गलन, पिघलना, गलना  
(n.) After the *thaw*, the streams flow fast.  
(v.) The ice on the pond will *thaw* when the weather gets warmer.

- The** (adj.) द, दी—(वह, वही), (उसी प्रकार, उसी रीति से)  
*The* moon is very cool. *The* sun is very hot.  
*The* man you met steals money.  
*The* shopkeeper you know is a dishonest man.  
I saw *the* fellow you had wanted.  
*The* sooner you go from this sad atmosphere, *the* better you will feel.  
I saw a cow on *the* road. *The* cow was grazing *the* grass.

- Theatre** (n.) थीअँटर—1. रंगमंच, नाचघर, नाट्यशाला  
Had you gone to the *theatre* last night?

2. अस्पताल में चीड़-फाड़ करने का स्थान  
The patient was moved to the operation theatre.

**Theft** (n.) थैफ्ट—चोरी, चोरी की वस्तु  
The police arrested a man for the theft of my bicycle. Theft is a crime.

**Theme** (n.) थीम—सार, संक्षेप, मूल विषय  
Please tell me the theme before narrating the whole story.

**Then** (adv.) दे'न—उस समय, तब  
Come, let us go to him at about nine P.M., he will be at home by then.  
We know it is wrong, then what is the alternative for it?

**Thence** (adv.) दे'न्स—उस स्थान से, तत्पश्चात्  
We went to Delhi and thence to Amritsar.

**Theory** (n.) थियोरि—सिद्धान्त, मत  
If anybody wants to study art properly, he should also learn the theory of it. Old stories had been based on the false theory that the sun is revolving and the earth is stationary.

**There** (adv.) दे'अर्—1. वहाँ (उस स्थान या स्थिति में)

Please do not go there, be seated here.

2. किसी स्थान के साथ पूरक रूप में  
There are fifteen students in the class.

There is no money in my purse.

**Therefore** (adv.) दे'अर्फोर—इसलिए, अतः, इस कारण से  
We are going to the cinema in the evening, therefore we will be home late.

**Thermometer** (n.) थर्मामीटर—तापमापी, थर्मामीटर  
A thermometer measures temperature.  
Do you know how to read a thermometer?

**They** (pron.) दे—वे, ये (लोग)  
There are your note-books. They are on the table.

(adj.) 2. उनका, उनकी  
They started the work by themselves.

All their things are here.  
The teacher gave them their note books.

**Thick** (adj.) थिक—घना, मोटा, गाढ़ा, गहरा  
It is hard to walk through the thick forest.

This board is thicker than that.

(n.) 2. कठिन समय  
I shall be with you through thick and thin.

3. सबसे व्यस्त, जरूरी हिस्सा  
Don't disturb me, I am in the thick of a job.

What is the thickness of it?

**Thicket** (n.) थिकिट—झुरमुट, झाड़-झंखाड़  
The robbers were hiding in the thicket.

**Thief** (n.) थीफ़—1. चोर-उचक्का  
People who steal things are called thieves. They are put into prison.  
Did anybody see the thief leaving the house?

(v.) 2. चुराना  
Someone has been thieving the sweets I think.

**Thigh** (n.) थाइ—जांघ, रान, जंघा  
Her thighs were swollen.  
The doctor prescribed an ointment.

**Thin** (adj.) थिन—पतला, दुर्बल, कमजोर  
If you do not eat your dinner well, you will grow thin.

You are a thin girl but she is fat.  
This needle is too thin. Please get me a thicker one.

**Thing** (n.) थिंग—वस्तु, चीज़  
Please give me something to eat.  
A thing of beauty is a joy for ever.

**Think** (v.) थिंक—1. सोचना  
Look before you leap. Think before you speak.

2. समझना  
Father thinks that Rajan is a nice man.

Have you thought about the next programme?

We should never think of taking what belongs to others.

I think you should see the doctor.

(n.) All philosophers are *thinkers*.

**Thirst** (n.) थर्स्ट—1. प्यास, पिपासा, तीव्र इच्छा  
Eating dry food gives us *thirst*.  
The traveller quenched his *thirst* at the well.  
My son has a great *thirst* for knowledge.

**This** (pron. & adj.) दिस—यह  
What is *this*?  
Would you rather have *this* pen or that one?  
Please look at *these* mangoes.  
Did you find *this* purse on the road?  
I intend to go to Calcutta *this* month.

**Thither** (adv.) थिदर—परला  
He was running hither and *thither*.

**Thorn** (n.) थॉर्न—कांटा, कंटक  
Baby's balloon settled on a rose bush and was punctured by its *thorns*.  
Life is full of *thorns*.

**Thorough** (adj.) थॉरो—सम्यक्, सम्पूर्ण  
You need a *thorough* check-up.  
(adv.) Check the luggage *thoroughly*.

**Thoroughfare** (n.) थॉरोफेअर—आम रास्ता  
This is not a *thoroughfare*.  
We can pass this way, it is a *thoroughfare*.

**Though** (conj.) दो—यद्यपि, भले ही  
The medicine will do you good, *though* you may not like the taste of it.  
She walks as *though* her feet hurt her.

**Thousand** (adj.) थाउज़ॅन्ड—हज़ार  
Ten hundreds make a *thousand*.  
A family man has to face a *thousand* and one worries in life.

**Thrash** (v.) थ्रैश—पीटना, मारना  
The mother will *thrash* the child if she catches him stealing the coins.

**Thread** थ्रेड—धागा (डालना)  
(v.) I will *thread* the needle.  
(n.) Have you a reel of black *thread*?

**Threat** थ्रेट—धमकी (देना)  
(v.) The teacher *threatened* to punish the whole class if there was any more noise.

(n.) The gardener's *threat* to thrash boys who steal the mangoes has frightened them away.

**Three** (adj.) थ्री—तीन  
*Three* little pigs ran a race. The black pig came *third*.  
*Three* is an odd figure.

**Threshold** (n.) थ्रे 'शोल्ड—दहलीज़  
As soon as we crossed the *threshold* of uncle's house, his dog barked loudly.

**Thrift** (n.) थ्रिफ्ट—मितव्ययिता, कमखर्ची  
By continuous *thrift*, Vagish saved enough money to buy a bike.  
(adj.) Mother taught us all to be *thrifty*.

**Thrill** थ्रिल—रोमांचित करना, पुलकित करना, रोमांच, पुलक  
(n.) I can't forget the *thrill* of winning my first prize.  
(adj.) It was a *thrilling* moment when the mother found her lost baby.

(v.) The news that she had won a prize *thrilled* her parents.

**Thrive** (v.) थ्राइव—फलना-फूलना  
We *thrive* on fresh air and wholesome food.

**Throat** (n.) थ्रोत—गला, कंठ  
The *throat* is the front part of the neck.  
Wear a scarf lest you should get a sore *throat*.

**Throb** (v.) थ्रॉब—धड़कना  
If you run in the race, your heart will *throb* painfully.

**Throne** (n.) थ्रोन—राजसिंहासन, राजगद्दी  
The English are loyal to the *throne*.  
(v.) The young queen was *dethroned* by rioters.

**Throng** (v.) थ्रॉंग—भीड़ लगाना, भीड़ से भर जाना  
People *thronged* the roads.

**Throttle** (v.) थ्रॉटल—गला घुटना  
The tight collar of my overcoat is *throttling* me.

**Through** (prep.) थ्रू—(के) आर पार, (के) पार, (के) दौरान  
The sun shines *through* the day and moon shines *through* the night.

The accident happened *through* my own carelessness.

**Throw** (v.) थ्रो—फेंकना, गिराना

The horse *threw* its rider off.

*Throw* me the ball, I will kick it.

This information may *throw* light upon the mystery of the rich man's death.

**Thrust** (v.) थ्रस्ट—पेलना, ढकेलना

Hari *thrust* his hand into his pocket to find out how many coins were there.

**Thumb** (n.) थैम—अंगूठा

We have two *thumbs*. The *thumb* is the thickest of our fingers.

Illiterate persons put their *thumb* impressions as signature.

**Thunder** (n.) थन्डर—1. गर्जन, बादलों की गर्ज

The lightning flashed and the *thunder* roared.

(v.) 2. गड़गड़ाने की आवाज़ करना

The engine came *thundering* along the rails.

3. क्रोध में भरकर बोलना, गरजना

The manager *thundered*—"Get out of here at once."

**Thursday** (n.) थर्सडे—बृहस्पतिवार

*Thursday* comes after Wednesday.

**Thus** (adv.) दस—इसलिए

We knew that he was dishonest, *thus* we did not believe him.

**Tick** (v.) टिक—निशान लगाना

The manager *ticked* the names of the employees who had been late in the morning.

**Ticket** (n.) टिकिट—टिकट

Always buy a *ticket* when you travel by bus or train.

**Tickle** (v.) टिकल्—गुदगुदाना

Baby laughs when mother *tickles* his toes.

**Tide** (n.) टाइड—ज्वारभाटा, लहर

At low *tide*, the sea falls and goes far out.

Time and *tide* wait for none.

The old lady is going *to* market.

It is five minutes *to* four.

Everyday Shanta spends minimum twenty minutes in her *toilet*.

(n.) The staff was corrupt from *top* to bottom.

**Topic** (n.) टॉपिक—विषय, प्रसंग, प्रकरण

Fashion, films and politics are the *topics* on which people generally talk.

What are the *topics* of today's discussion?

**Topple** (v.) टॉपल—गिर पड़ना

The big pile of books *toppled* over.

The pile of bricks came *toppling* down.

**Torch** (n.) टॉर्च—मशाल, टार्च (सेलों वाली)

My friend gave me a *torch* to see my way in the night.

**Towel** (n.) टॉइल—तौलिया

We wipe our wet hands on the *towel*.

Have you a bath-*towel* in your bathroom?

**Tower** (v. & n.) टॉवर-टाउअर्—ऊँचा उठना, मीनार, लाट, बुर्ज

The tall fir trees *tower* over the small house.

We can hear the bells ringing in the clock-*tower*.

**Town** (n.) टाउन—कस्बा, छोटा शहर

A *town* is a small city.

There are streets and shops in a *town*.

She would rather live in a village than a *town*.

**Toy** (n.) टॉय—खिलौना

Children play with their *toys*.

(v.) 2. खेलना, खिलवाड़ करना

All the time she talked she was *toying* with her purse.

**Trace** (v.) ट्रेस—1. खोज निकालना

The police are trying to *trace* the man who stole the van.

(n.) 2. अनुरेखित करना, खींचना

You can *trace* a map from your atlas.

(n.) 3. थोड़ी मात्रा, अल्प मात्रा

The soup has a *trace* of onion in it.

**Track** (v.) ट्रैक—1. खोजना, पीछा करना

Some trains carry people. They are called passenger-trains. Some trains carry goods. They are called goods-trains.

**Transfer** (v.) ट्रैन्स्फर—तबादला करना, दूसरी जगह ले जाना  
The luggage was transferred from the station to the ship.

*Treason* is one of the most serious crimes.

**Treasure** (v.) ट्रेजर—संजोये रखना, बहुत सम्भालकर रखना

I *treasure* my gold watch.

(n.) Many *treasures* of gold and silver have been found in old castles.

**Treat** ट्रीट—1. इलाज करना  
(v.) Doctors *treat* their patients.

It was a *treat* to hear such good singing.

They were caught for *trespassing* on government property.

**Trial** (n.) ट्राइअल—परीक्षण, जांच, परख  
The latest car model is having its *trial* this week.

Truth fears no *trial*.

**Triangle** (n.) ट्राइऐंगल—त्रिकोण, त्रिभुज  
Can you draw a *triangle*?

**Tribe** (n.) ट्राइब—जन-जाति  
There are many *tribes* in India.

**Tribunal** (n.) ट्रिब्यूनल—अदालत, कचहरी, न्यायालय

The Supreme Court is the highest *tribunal* in India.

**Tribute** (n.) ट्रिब्यूट—प्रशंसा, आभार  
M.P. paid *tributes* to the voters who had helped him in the elections.

**Trick** (n.) ट्रिक—युक्ति, दाँव-पेंच  
Every profession has its *tricks*.  
We are bitter against those who *trick* us.

**Tricycle** (n.) ट्राइसाइकल—तीन पहियों वाली साइकल  
A *tricycle* runs on wheels. It has three wheels.

**Trifle** (n.) ट्राइफैल—छोटी-सी बात, तुच्छ बात, छोटा मसला  
Mother told Raju not to cry over *trifles*.

Those who apply themselves too much to *trifles* usually become

incapable of achieving great things.  
*Trifles* make perfection and perfection is not *trifle*.

**Triumph** (*n.*) ट्राइअंफ—विजय, जीत, सफलता  
 We were given a day's holiday to celebrate our *triumph* in winning the football cup.

**Trivial** (*adj.*) ट्रिविअल—तुच्छ, नगण्य, छोटी-सी  
 I made only a *trivial* mistake.

The driver was summoned for a *trivial* motoring offence.

**Trolley** (*n.*) ट्रॉलि—एक छोटी छकड़ा गाड़ी या ठेला जिसे हाथों से धकेला जाता है  
 In the hospital, tea is served from a *trolley*.

**Troop** (*n.*) ट्रूप—1. दल, टोली, मंडली

I am sorry to *trouble* you while you are so busy.

**Tuesday** (*n.*) ट्यूज़डे—मंगलवार

**Tuft** (*n.*) टफ्ट—गुच्छ, झाड़ी का एक हिस्सा

There was sand and a few *tufts* of coarse grass.

Trains sometimes run through the *tunnels*.

**Turban** (*n.*) टर्बन—पगड़ी, पाग

In India some people used to wear *turbans* on their heads.

**Turbulent** (*adj.*) टर्बुलेंट—उपद्रवी, उग्र

Nothing could control the *turbulent* mob.

**Turkey** (n.) टर्कि—अमरीकी गीध

A turkey is a big bird. The Americans like to eat it.

**Turn** (n.) टर्न—1. बारी

Gopal is having a ride on a horse. It will be my turn after him.

It is my turn to bat.

Ram's turn was next.

(v.) 2. घूमना, पलटना

The horse will turn around when it comes to the fence.

Things don't turn up in this world until somebody turns them up.

3. उलटना

Shyama likes turning over the pages in her story book.

(adv.) 4. भलाई का बदला भलाई

One good turn deserves another.

**Turnip** (n.) टर्निप—शलजम

A turnip is a vegetable. Mother cooks turnips for dinner.

**Twenty** (adj.) ट्वेंटी—बीस

Two tens make twenty.

**Twice** (adj.) ट्वाइस—दो बार, दुगुना

Hear twice before you speak once.

**Twig** (n.) ट्विग—टहनी, शाखा

The birds were sitting on the twigs while singing.

**Twilight** (n.) ट्विलाइट—सान्ध्य प्रकाश, झुटपुटा, सूर्योदय से पहले का समय

We must go for a walk in the twilight.

**Twin** (adj.) ट्विन—जुड़वा (बच्चा)

Lava and Kusha were twins.

**Twinkle** (v.) ट्विंकल—टिमटिमाना, चमकना

The stars twinkle in the sky.

In the dark we could see the stars twinkling.

Your eyes twinkled with mischief.

**Twirl** (v.) ट्वर्ल—घुमाना, फिराना

The dancers twirl each other round in time with the music.

**Twist** (v.) ट्विस्ट—बटना, बल देना, मोड़ना, ऐंठना

Rope is made by twisting lengths of cord together.

Mary twisted her ankle when she fell.

Twist those strings together to make a strong rope.

**Twitter** (v.) ट्विटर—चहचहाना, चहकना

The birds twitter cheerfully in the trees.

**Two** (adj.) टू—दो

One plus one make two.

There are two words for everything.

We select either according to our liking.

**Type** टाइप—प्रकार, किस्म, सिक्के का अक्षर टाइप करना

(n.) We find several types of vegetables.

Different kinds of types are often used for one printed page.

(v.) Please ask the typist to type carefully.

**Typhoid** (n.) टाइफाइड—आन्त्र-ज्वर

Typhoid is often caused by eating and drinking impure food or drink.

**Tyrant** (n.) टाइरन्ट—तानाशाह, निरंकुश शासक
